



She is a fifty-year member and said she enjoys reading our newsletter that keeps her updated on the activities of the chapter. I know she would love to hear from our members with cards and phone calls that just say hello. **Chris Mason, PM**, our member that moved back to Arkansas, wanted to let us know that she is still doing great after her cancer surgery in December and to let us know that she is still not smoking. **Art Paris, PP**, called 911 June 10th about 3:00 AM, and got a ride from the paramedics to St. Joseph's emergency with back pains. He found out that his kidneys were full of fluid. After draining his kidneys and a few days of rest in the hospital he was released. **Ray Davies, PP**, was in the hospital on June 29th. He had contacted another case of cellulitis in his leg. **George Lawson, PP**, was out walking for quite a while in the heat July 21st and after returning home paramedics were called. He had suffered a minor heart attack and was able to come home from the hospital the next day. **Jerry Murphy** was taken to the hospital on July 24th by the paramedics after experiencing a dizzy spell at Costco. 
